Faculty Rumination by Miss. Billion



This year is an exciting one for the Latin Department at Holy Spirit Academy. We have embarked upon a new approach to learning the Latin language, which linguists have termed the Direct Method. This name may make it sound like some sophisticated theory, but in reality, the concept is very simple—in fact, it is the very way human beings have been naturally acquiring language skills since the beginning of time. The philosophy behind this method is to connect any given word with an image or, even better, with the thing itself. If we imagine teaching a young child English, we use this same approach. We might say, "Apple!" and hand them an apple chew-toy. While Latin has been treated as a dead language for many years, it is possible, and even more effective, to follow this method. It brings the language into the forefront of students' working memory, which they can then draw from with greater ease. The Latin students at Holy Spirit Academy are on their way to reaching a level of reading and speaking fluency that is uncommon in Latin classrooms today, and having both the ability and facility to unlock the tomes of Latin text that constitute the intellectual tradition of the West!
